Thoughts from the Pastor

As we enter into February, thoughts always lean toward love. On day a year, cards, candies, and flowers are given as tokens of our affection. However, as followers of Jesus, our practice of love is an everyday spiritual endeavor. Jesus commanded our spiritual ancestors to let go of the laws of the past (what we call the Old Testament) and to take up a new commandment. We are to love God, love our neighbor as we love ourselves, and love our enemies.

Jesus teaches that the way to love God is in prayer, worship, and action. He sought out quiet places to pray, away from the crowds and alone with his community or even alone in nature. Jesus, also, worshiped with community on every sabbath as was the custom. When we offer up prayers of gratitude, hope, and concern for all of creation, when we sing hymns of love, hope, and faith, when we gather in community to worship, listen, and learn, we have loved God.

When we love someone, we do the things that please that beloved. This is true in our relationship with God. Jesus acts with love for others because this is the way of God and he tells his followers to "go and do likewise." When we dedicate our spiritual practice to loving the God revealed in Jesus, we respect all that God love's — all people, all creation which includes ourselves and others. It is a love that stands up and protects the sacred lands of this country's first people. It is a love that affirms women can have control over their own bodies. It is a love that says we need to make feeding hungry families easier not harder. It is a love that says the refugee must find a safe place with us. It is a life of practiced love, a life of compassion.

Whom are we to love? Well, God first but the paradox is that in loving God first we are moved at the same time to love our neighbor and our enemy. It is the promise or more often the experience God's love that moves us to love our neighbor and our enemy. Through this, we act so that everyone has the basics that we want for ourselves — jobs, homes, food, and healthcare. An oddity of this way of Jesus is that when we work for these basics for our enemies shelter, food, medicine, and humane work, violence is reduced and those we call our enemies become our neighbors.

This February let us worship the God revealed in Jesus who commands us to love - not as a feeling but as a way of life. Let that love strengthen us as we celebrate Black History Month and continue in the love that will overcome systemic racism. Let us enter into Lent letting God's love cleanse way all the doubts about how much God loves us. Let us embrace the ways we love God in our worship, prayers, and actions so that we may love our neighbor and our enemy. Let us embrace that love and know that there is no person, no part of creation, that is outside God's love.



Area faith leaders call for people to stand united against violence

As Faith Leaders and Leaders of Conscience of Eastern Washington and North Idaho, we reach out to our fellow citizens to stand united against the violence that took place at the United States Capitol on Jan. 6. We call upon all Republican and Democratic public servants, politicians, and religious authorities to courageously speak out and condemn this attack on democracy and its institutions.

Our nation's healing requires that all those involved, regardless of their office, religion, or skin color, stand before a court of law to be held accountable for their actions. This includes [former] President Trump, the 12 Republican Senators and 126 Republican Representatives who enabled him, and the thousands in the mob who caused harm, terror, and destruction. Find your elected officials at https://www.usa.gov/elected-officials and contact them.

Furthermore, we must challenge the media outlets that wittingly and unwittingly repeated the extremists' and the [former] President's lies. Their audiences

sincerely believed that the election was stolen. This moved citizens to violence. Our nation will continue to be devastated if we tolerate the further repetition of unsubstantiated accusations and assertions. At the same time, we recognize the reporters who put their lives in danger to provide accurate coverage.

To heal our nation, a full investigation into why the capital police were left unable to maintain order must be made and those responsible must be held accountable. Noting that the police presence was far more substantial during the March for Science, the Women's March, and all Black Lives Matters events, we seek answers to the questions about the role of the [former] President and law makers in the lack of security. Further, we join with all people of conscience in recognizing that systemic racism played a major role as did the cultural tolerance of radicalized "Christian" whites. We must face this and commit ourselves to the dismantling of systemic racism and religious extremism of every kind.

Wherever you live and work, let that be the place where you are the change. Join with us, as people of all spiritual practices and political parties, in strengthening our democracy. Demand verifiable facts from ourselves, every leader, and all media outlets. Contact those in power and demand that we refocus ourselves and our nation on the common good which begins with holding accountable those who were part of the attack.
