Thoughts from the Pastor

At this time last year, we were at the beginning of life in a pandemic. No one among us could have imagine that a year later 500,000 Americans would die. The grieving for these lives and for all the ugliness this pandemic has exposed might make it seem like we have been in Lent for an entire year.

Jesus showed us how to make our daily life a spiritual practice. We are a people who pause to worship with prayers, words, and songs that strengthen us to continue in this work. Like the old spiritual says, hold on, pray on, and sing on just a little while longer, everything will be alright. Oh, yes there is a fourth verse. What we know about Jesus is that he practiced all four of these verses in his daily life as he worked on to reveal the Kin-dom of God on Earth.

There is much in need of holding on, praying on, singing on and working on. This year, we have witnessed the physical infection of Covid-19 and the metastasizing cancers of white supremacy and Christian nationalism. We will not forget our country's use of force against those who protested the death of George Floyd. We must not forget that the armed, white Proud Boys showed up to "protect property" at the Spokane Black Lives Matter event. Our sheriff even dismissed the problem of them impersonating law enforcement. We must not forget that this group was among the armed white rioters and terrorists that stormed the Capitol on January 6. The FBI has already arrested one of their leaders from Sandpoint. White folk can no longer deny our nation's systemic tolerance of white violence.

Brené Brown, an American professor, writes and lectures about the importance of owning our stories so the stories don't own us. As Americans, we must own our national story of white supremacy and Christian Nationalism. It is part of our story. It is not all of our story. Owning our history of white supremacy and Christian dominionism gives us the opportunity to choose who we will be moving forward.

This is the practice of Lent. We own our stories. We own that we have fallen short of our best path. We "turn around" from that which separates us from a humble walk with God. We return to the practice of following the way of Jesus.

We have been living what feels like a year of Lent. As the Covid-19 pandemic looks like it is beginning to show signs of becoming controlled, our national cancer of systemic racism still has a long way to go. Dr. Susan Neiman recently spoke to WSU students about how the Germans came to deal with their Nazi past. She said, "Germans did something that no one had ever done even though it was a long and very hard struggle... They said, "Well, yes we did suffer in the war and certainly after the war, but other people suffered more, and their suffering was our fault. "She went on to say, "And no nation has ever done that which is quite important. They haven't done it perfectly. There is still a lot of work to be done." Healing is possible. We own our story, and we choose to hold on, pray on, sing on, and work on until the day when everything will be alright!
